For years, the estimate of the undocumented population in the U.S. has hovered around 11 million, despite the country's significant growth in overall population. Critics argue that this static number is unrealistic and suggest the figure is far higher. The Federation for American Immigration Reform (FAIR) recently estimated the undocumented population at 18.6 million—over 7 million more than the older estimate—though even this figure faces skepticism, with some speculating the number could be 40 million or more. Remember, these numbers do NOT include those who have come here legally from Non Europea nations.

The United States has 94 people per square mile. This low density is why some “experts” argue there is room for more immigrants.

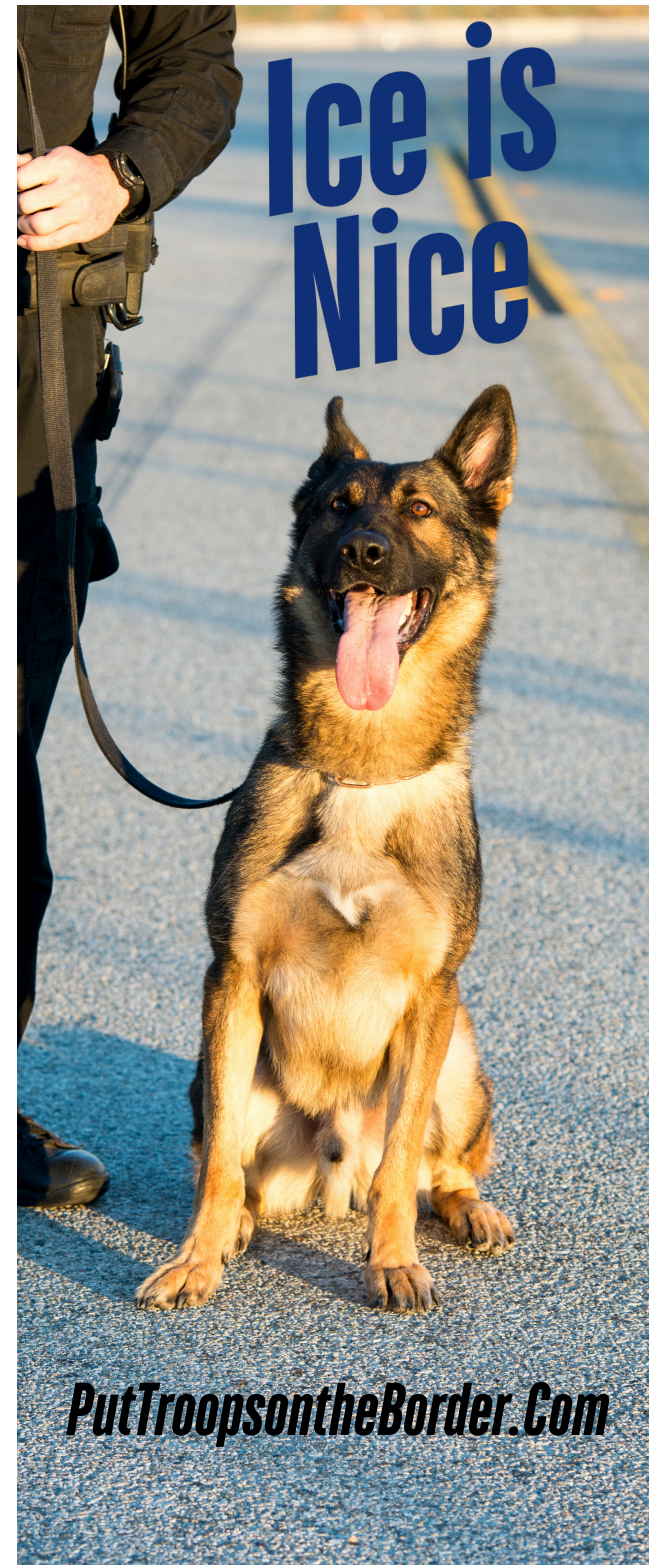
- Mexico: ~170 people per square mile
- India: ~1,205 people per square mile
- China: ~397 people per square mile
- Philippines: ~939 people per square mile
- El Salvador: ~790 people per square mile
- Vietnam: ~816 people per square mile
- Cuba: ~264 people per square mile
- Dominican Republic: ~580 people per square mile
- Guatemala: ~430 people per square mile
- South Korea: ~1,366 people per square mile

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Before 1965, U.S. immigration law favored immigrants from Europe and mostly barred immigration from Asia. The 1965 Immigration and Nationality Act opened immigration from Asia and Latin America. **Since 1965, approximately 72 million immigrants have come to the United States. Additional Acts have increased legal immigration and refugee status for millions who do not share America's historic makeup.**

From 1880 to 1889, about 90% of U.S. immigrants came from Europe, including about 90% from Germany, Ireland, and the United Kingdom. Almost 90 % of immigrants from 1889 to 1919 came from Europe. Nearly 60% came from Italy, Austria-Hungary, and Russia-Poland. Most immigrants were from Europe until 1965. Of course, this does not include the approximate 388,000 Africans brought as slaves and sold to whites, blacks, Jews, and Indians; a terrible institution that created havoc in the nation. However, it does include hundreds of thousands of European indentured servants. America had an overwhelming "European" and Christian identity. While there were cultural differences, they had a common heritage and faith.

The U.S. Census Bureau predicts that America's population will grow by another 70 million in the next 40 years, with immigration accounting for roughly 90%, to around 450 million. Continuing onto 2100, the discrepancy widens even further. The Census Bureau's medium projection is 571 million, more than a doubling of today's U.S. population. If the same cropland loss rate continued from 1992-97, the United States would lose approximately 110 million acres (about 30%) of its remaining 375 million cropland.
